This book touches on a few things that COULD have been helpful, but never goes deep enough to be worthwhile. The whole section on cross-training, for example, is essentially just: "Cross-training is important. You should take stairs when you're at work." Chapters are usually only 2-3 pages long, which includes a half-page sized picture. Also, everything seems to have a negative attitude towards skater interaction--not one of the skater archetypes she lists in one chapter is a positive description of a roller girl. And like another reviewed mentioned, there are some very disappointing language choices--author says "retard" quite a bit and also makes some rape jokes. As part of the roller derby community, I am embarrassed by this book. :(
